1.	<p>An article</p> <p>An article is an expression of one’s thought on an issue or a subject logically written in meaningful paragraphs. It is a piece of writing usually intended for publication in a newspaper, magazine or journal .It should be written in an interesting or entertaining manner and give opinions and thoughts, as well as facts .</p> <p>An article can</p> <p>describe an experience, event, person or place present an opinion or balanced argument ,compare and contrast provide information ,offer suggestions ,offer advice</p> <p>A realistic article should consist of:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. an eye-catching title which attracts the readers’ attention and suggests the theme of the article. 2. an introduction which clearly defines the topic to be covered and keeps the reader’s attention. Begin with a striking opening sentence which addresses the readers and gets them interested in the topic. 3. the main body of two paragraphs in which the topic is further developed in detail. Present a strong argument for your ideas supporting it with evidences. Use linking devices (however, therefore, although, ...) to make the composition appear a whole. Develop your ideas to make them interesting. 4. the conclusion - summarising the topic or a final opinion, recommendation or comment. Conclude with your strongest point. <p>TIPS</p> <p>Read the question carefully, use CODER, write the points and expand them in three four paragraphs, plan, organize and present ideas coherently, be creative, precise, use proper layout.</p>

II/III Para: Content -Causes, effects, present state of affairs, etc.
